Our History

Founded in 1982 the Winterthur Cricket Club plays cricket in the Swiss town of Winterthur, approximately 25 kilometres east of Zurich and is fully associated to the Swiss Cricket Association (SCA).

Winterthur is one of five Swiss clubs that play cricket on an artificial grass. It participates in the national league, of which it was champions in 2000 and in 2002, the domestic Swiss Cricket Mr. Pickwick Cricket Cup, T20 competition, hosts its very own annual cricket festival and travels on tour to European destinations, such as Italy, England Czech Republic and Germany.

Winterthur is also the adopted home of the regional youth team, the Zurich Crickets Cricket Club.

Winterthur Cricket club attracts members from a multiple of cultures & backgrounds. For this reason the club has adopted English as its official club language.

The club also has quite an extensive social side which has in the past included such events as



bowling evenings, BBQ's and Brunches, Men's Only Night, Club Ski-Weekend, Bowling and Billiards and numerous other events.

In order to finance these activities, the grounds and equipment, the club charges a

modest Active or alternatively Passive membership fee.

Cricket enjoys a long tradition of fair play and gentlemanly conduct. A game of two teams trying to score as many 'runs' as possible in a limited time, cricket is a unique team sport of individual performances and tactical decisions.

Closer to home it is played as an amateur sport in Austria, Belgium, Croatia, Cyprus, Denmark, France, Finland, Germany, Greece, Ireland, Luxembourg, Italy, Holland, Malta, Norway, Portugal, Scotland, Spain - and of course in Switzerland by 450 registered senior and 650 junior cricketers in twenty-three clubs and six schools.

There are also over 45 coaches, 50 umpires and an additional estimated 1,200 passive members.

Cricketers come from all over Switzerland, mainly from the Geneva, Bern and Zürich areas. They are typically bi-lingual, possess a good awareness of multiple cultures, enjoy an above average schooling and subsequently above average income.

Cricket is played on public sports fields and school grounds with an artificial pitch. Thanks to the support of local sports councils, Basel, C.E.R.N., Cossonay, Geneva & Winterthur have permanent NottsSport© surfaces.
